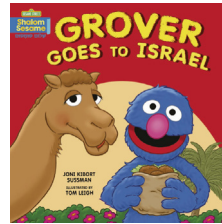


Engineer Arielle and the Israel Independence Day Surprise

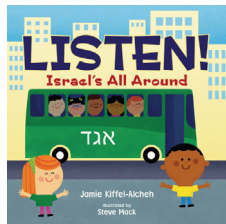

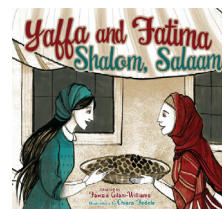


Beni's War

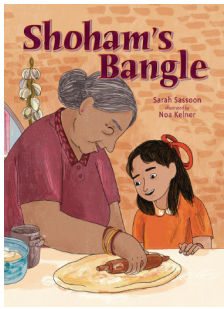

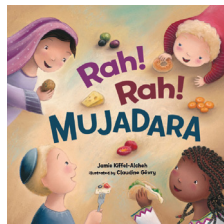

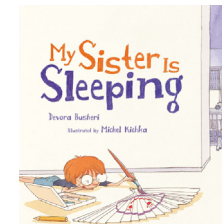
Rah! Rah! Mujadara

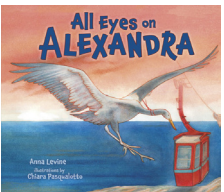

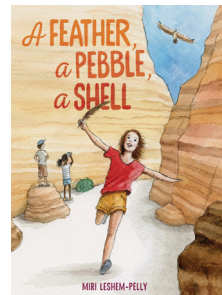

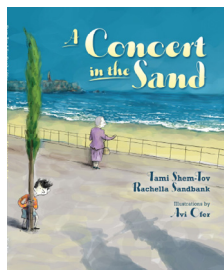


A Feather, a Pebble, a Shell

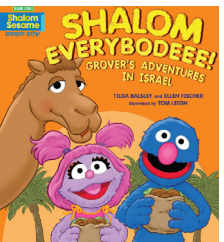
